

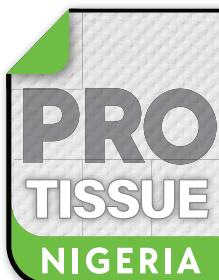

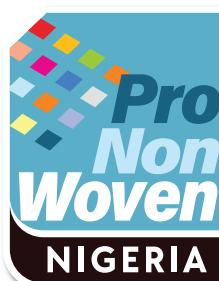
Pro Corrugated Nigeria - Premium Business Event for Corrugated & Carton Box Manufacturers in Nigeria

Pro-Corrugated under the banner of ProPaper Nigeria is happening at a time when the corrugated and packaging market in Africa is passing through a rapid modernisation phase. This is largely driven by the shift from plastic to paper packaging with ecommerce driving the packaging sector. It is estimated that the African packaging market was worth US\$45.15 billion in 2025, and is on its way to reach US\$56.62 billion by 2030, growing at a CAGR of 4.63 per cent. In the overall Middle East and Africa (MEA) the corrugated segment alone is worth US\$9.03 billion. The corrugated segment growth is thriving on the 'Paper Shift' even though plastic still holds a 48 per cent sway.

The paper tissue market is exponentially growing in Africa and is anticipated to touch US\$4.2 billion by 2033 from US\$2.6 billion in 2024. Nigeria is at the forefront in tissue consumption. It is estimated that the country has a 43 per cent share in consumption and production. The African tissue market is driven by rapid urbanisation and the rising middle class, particularly in South Africa, Egypt and Kenya. The tissue market is expected to grow at a CAGR of 4.7 per cent in the next five years. Key products include, toilet paper, facial tissue and paper towels



Pro-Nonwoven Nigeria - Discover latest Innovations & business opportunities in Non-Woven Industry

Africa's non-woven textile market is on a high growth curve, estimated to be increasing at a CAGR of 6.9 per cent. The anticipation is that this segment will touch US\$2.43 billion by 2030 from US\$1.63 billion registered in 2024. Predominantly, main segments driving the growth are durable fabrics with a 65.3 per cent market share – used extensively in construction for geotextiles, automotive industry for interiors and furniture. It is also used in non-durable items like diapers, sanitary pads and medical masks. Across Africa, South Africa is the most mature market in this category valued at US\$820 million while Central and West Africa are the fastest growing regions. Nigeria is one of the critical players in the non-woven landscape.



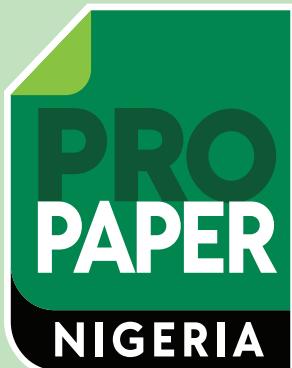
